

A New Era of Sports at Huckins

When campers arrive at Huckins this summer, many of the staples we all know, and love, will remain constant. The white gates will continue to be the welcoming pillar as you enter the driveway; the smiling staff in their green and white will greet new and returning families; and that feeling of joy, excitement (and a little nervousness, perhaps) will remain with many as they meet their cabin mates for the first time. There will also be some new accompany with the traditional sights and feelings. Specifically, improvements to our Sports Complex and layout of the Sportsfield.

The Board of Directors and Camp Leadership have been diligently working through aspects of our Master Plan, which was developed through an intensive charette in 2017. During that process, a concept arrived which



resonated with all—connecting the Sports Complex to the Sportsfield by extending the field and re-locating some elements on the ropes course.



This plan was further fine-tuned as we re-imagined a more usable and functional space with renovations to the Sports Complex. Huckins was guided through this process with consultation and design services by the team at Simons Architects in Portland, Maine.

In Spring 2021, this work began with Phase 1, which included the replacement of the existing roof and the addition of acoustic panels to the interior walls and roof trusses. These improvements made the space more user friendly, especially as Huckins navigated the re-opening of camp after being closed for summer 2020. This provided us with a space where the entire camp community could gather safely.

In October 2021, Huckins hired Cobb Hill Construction, from Concord NH to complete Phase 2 of

the project. This included the addition of a 1,900 sq ft mezzanine floor, extending the full length of the building. The mezzanine floor will provide an added space for campers to play games, quiet space to connect with each other and additional space for staff time off. This phase also includes the addition of garage doors and windows to





help with added ventilation and accessibility, specifically in the direction toward the Sportsfield. The renovations include the addition of commercial grade fans and a pergola facing the Sportsfield. Phase 2 will be completed in May. The 3rd Phase of the project started in February and includes removing the trees and root matter to connect the Sportsfield to the sports complex. The final phase will conclude this Fall, with the loaming and seeding to extend our green, usable field space.

As you drive, walk, or stay at Huckins this summer, we invite you to take a tour of these updated facilities. As this project develops, it is quite exciting to stand on the Tennis Courts or under the new pergola and see how our Sports facilities are expanding, improving, and connecting. It is fair to say that the Sports at Huckins are entering a new era!

ast summer, as the community sat together in the chapel preparing for Candlelight, we paused and looked up at the outline of the pine trees against the night sky. Thoughts from the Kitchen

ooking out my window on a February morning, silent piles of snow and ice belie the hum of activity, chorus of voices and sun-warmed joy that will soon descend on this place. While there is plenty of evidence of much work being done to get ready for summer, most of Camp lies quiet and waiting.

Living in New Hampshire means being accustomed to the constant change in seasons, light, temperature, colors and rhythms. 2022 marks my 10th year here in Freedom, watching these changes as Camp morphs from winter sleep to spring awakening to summer exuberance. 10 years. In Huckins parlance, that is "Double Huckster". In Jody Skelton parlance, it's "a drop in the bucket"! For me, it has meant watching my family grow here, meeting people from all corners of the earth, making friendships that I know will last my lifetime and of course, producing staggering quantities of food. In that time, I have seen 7 tons of watermelon consumed at cookouts, 550 gallons of olive oil used for marinating and salad dressings, 3 1/2 tons of cucumbers sliced for the salad bars, 3 ½ tons of butter whipped into mashed potatoes and baked into breakfasts and desserts and 25,000 ears of corn shucked.

Constant change is not unique to the weather. Long standing, venerable communities like Huckins grow and improve and evolve. Our food program has evolved as well. Some changes are beyond our control and reactionary, others are more intentional. Since 2013, we have been able to make so many improvements: a new kitchen floor, new kitchen ventilation system, new grills, ovens and a tilt skillet, a huge solar array on the roof, a new dining hall floor, dishwasher and hot holding upgrades, to name but a few. Our kitchen would be the envy of many chefs.

Last summer we reacted daily to new challenges as we navigated Camp in this different world. Salad bars were removed and served-buffets replaced family-style meals in an attempt to keep each other safe and distanced. Paper plates made serving food with a fraction of our kitchen staff possible. Menus changed constantly to account for shifting supply.

More deliberate, less immediate changes like incorporating fresh, local, scratch-made ingredients into our meals and working to remove highly processed, sugar-filled items take more time and are a continual work in progress. The work of making our food more nutritious, more delicious, more sustainable will hopefully never stop.

The vision for food at Huckins in 2022 and beyond is optimistic. I am determined to see our salad bars return, brimming with veggies from Pork Hill and Mountain Heartbeet Farm. We will happily get back to family-style eating and passing platters of pancakes and bowls of Mac and Cheese to our cabin mates. I am excited for these small steps toward normalcy and their restorative effect on our eating experience. Our tent in front of the dining hall will be replaced with a new tent extending from the south end of the dining hall, making more room to spread out but keeping the sense of togetherness that meals have always had. As COVID forced us to make changes it has also encouraged us to rethink our dining hall space. We now have a long-term goal to renovate the bathrooms and to turn the tent space into a permanent extension of our dining area. We envision this space being a welcome expansion for meals and rainy-day activities as well as providing more versatility during pre- and post-camp programming. We are also working with our vendors to

> continue finding ways to reduce our environmental footprint. We have made great strides over the years in this area but there is still more work to be done and we are grateful to be able to keep this in our sights.

Entering my 10th summer, I am proud of the ways we have been able to enhance our food program and look forward to finding new and better ways to fuel our bodies, minds and spirits in the summers to come. Our kitchen team is ready and eager for the snow to melt and to see those happy, hungry faces arrive once again.



The King and Queen of Service

On the verge of Summer 2022, we would like to send our most sincere gratitude to two people who volunteered tirelessly, serving often behind the scenes for 8 years at Huckins.

From 2014–2021 Peter and Jill King made Camp

Huckins their summer home and were invaluable in their efforts to do any and everything that was needed to help make Camp run more smoothly. Each spring, they were often the first to arrive at Camp. Suddenly, they would show up in the kitchen and say, "What can we do? How can we help? What time is dinner?" In their time volunteering at Camp, there doesn't seem to be a corner that has been untouched by their service.

Anyone at Camp in the last few years that has enjoyed lumbering to the dining hall for a fresh, hot cup of coffee, has Jill to thank. She was always the first person to the kitchen in the morning to make sure that coffee was brewing, and cream and sugar were ready, before heading off to the office to lend her assistance and often the last person there at night, rinsing coffee urns, grinding coffee beans for the next day and making sure we knew if we needed to order more. When she wasn't giving her time in the kitchen, she was a constant presence in the office. Her amazing attention to detail and willingness to jump into any project, however tedious, quickly made her an indispensable part of the team. She opened and repackaged hundreds of UPS boxes so campers could get their care packages and was the Queen of finding hidden candy, even if sewn into a teddy bear!

Peter was the King of any errand. From daily mail runs to supply runs for the kitchen, office or program to prescription pick-ups to laundry runs, he did it all. He was the savior of many cookouts, always making sure we had full propane tanks for the grills. We always knew he would be ready and willing to help with anything that a day at camp could throw at us. Peter also was Jody's "right hand man" in starting and growing the fishing program. His passion for, dedication to and obvious joy in this program allowed countless Juniors to fish during counselor's free time as well as many, many family campers and Mother/ Son - Mother/Daughter campers.



Peter and Jill were always amazing in their ability to see a need and fill it. They often were tackling projects before anyone else knew there was a need. Wiping tables, mopping up spills, emptying trash, filling gas tanks, no job was too big or small. If there was an ongoing need, they would just say, "we've got this." And they did and you never had to think of it again. There was a certain comfort in knowing they were around.

In 2020, when our world

stuttered to a standstill and no one was sure if they should even leave their home, Peter and Jill arrived as always, ready to work. Their efforts that summer, as Camp became a bubble, were extraordinary. They became full-time members of our tiny kitchen crew and worked many hours scrubbing pots, running the dishwasher, rolling silverware, serving meals and helping with local lunch distribution. Evenings, we were a 3-person dinner crew and Joel was under strict instructions not to wash a single dish.

In addition to their many talents in finding ways to help, they have always been enthusiastic foodies. They have an appreciation for good food and were always quick to praise a meal that they really enjoyed. Sometimes, when cooking 1500 meals a day, those few words of affirmation were so needed and validating. Often, we would judge the success of a meal or a soup on Peter's enthusiasm, watching from the kitchen, waiting for the reaction. Their love of Camp is strong and longstanding. Peter can tell stories of being at Camp as a young man and watching Jody as a camper. They often could be seen out for an evening kayak or canoe, or Peter would ask Jody for the "keys to the Hobie" and have a sail around Broad Bay. They were the guardians and chroniclers of our baby loon. They invested personal time in our international staff, getting to know them, being wonderful ambassadors for Huckins and making great connections. Peter loved to take a crew out for an after-dinner boat ride to the big lake or an impromptu trip to the Pizza Barn.

The list grows longer with each person that you talk to about Peter and Jill's impact on Camp. We are forever grateful for the many ways that they made our days easier and improved the camp experience in their selfless service to Huckins.

Peter and Jill, thank you! We wish you all the best in your next adventure and we know that it will be equally impactful. We hope to see you again soon on the shores of Ossipee.



What ever happened to... **Erika Werner**

"1-9-8-6 at Huckins Camp, no other year the same..." I still remember feeling the complete certainty of this statement as our junior voices rang out during my first summer at Huckins. However, over my subsequent decade as a camper and then counselor, what has stuck with me is how the truth of this song each year runs in parallel with unchanging Huckins' spirit.

I was raised by a "Huckins girl", surrounded by Huckins aunts and Huckins friends. The first "concert" I attended was a Shaw Brothers outdoors performance when I was 7. When I started camp at age 10, there were far fewer alumni kids than there are now, and so I was one of the few who had known many of the songs since early childhood. Yet despite this early imprinting, there was somehow enough space at Huckins that my camp experience became entirely my own, separate from all of my family members.

There is a lot of growing up that happens between age 10 and 20 and Huckins helped me at every step along the way. Huckins is the first place that I came without any friends and learned that I had everything I needed to make wonderful new relationships. A lesson that allowed me to go a little further for college, being the only one from my high school to attend UVA. Huckins is the first place that I learned that sometimes flipping things upside down is more fun than keeping them right side up. Huckins is the first place I learned to clean a bathroom, a skill I perfected over many years. It is also the place I got my first formal "job" evaluation and the first place I learned to be responsible when given 24 hours off at age 17 with no adult supervision.

Even after my summers at Huckins ended, the lessons I learned have continued to serve me well. After college graduation, I tried a few different careers but eventually ended up in medical school. Medicine can be all consuming, but Huckins taught me the importance of having fun at work, something I continue to make a priority. I ended up focusing my medical career on high risk obstetrics. I love the questions I can answer with research and the families who I get to support through challenging times. I love teaching the next generation of physicians and mentoring junior faculty. As my career has progressed, I have taken on administrative roles and last year I transitioned from

Division Director of Maternal Fetal Medicine at Brown University to Chair of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Tufts University School of Medicine. Particularly in these roles, I have often reflected on how well Huckins prepared me. Simple tools that I learned as a CIT and practiced as a counselor, like starting with "I" statements and listening for both feelings and facts, continue to be strategies I employ daily.

I also use my counseling skills as a parent regularly. Thanks to an incredibly supportive partner and family, I had my first daughter during residency and my second during fellowship. While my husband Frazier does far more of the school events and pick-ups than I do, I managed to sing both of my kids to sleep to Huckins tunes regularly, taught them both to swim (and tread) in the waters of Ossipee, and each summer we pick wild blueberries between the pines of Huckins Road. My kids are as different as could be but both Emma (age 16) and Julia (age 11) love their time at Huckins. I am so grateful that as much as things change each year, Huckins continues to provide a foundation for so many kids. May 2-0-2-2 at Huckins Camp be another completely unique and inspiring year.

From The Ground Up

Updates on Facility Improvements at Huckins

As we press through the final weeks of winter and welcome spring, our Maintenance team will begin the annual process of getting Camp for the upcoming season. This process includes turning on the seasonal water systems, annual checks, repairs, cleaning all buildings and moving boats and equipment to their summer homes. This is an exciting time of year as we prepare the buildings and grounds to be the ultimate fun machine for our community. More than ever, the team is working diligently to order with vendors and schedule contractors early to help manage supply chain challenges and labor shortages. Several other improvements and renovations are also in the works for summer. Here is a glimpse at some of those projects:

- Bathhouse upgrades, including the addition of privacy stall extensions on showers to create a changing space and improvements to toilet stall doors.
- New mattresses for Middler Division cabins.
- Updated furniture for many staff cabins, including beds, mattresses, and dressers.
- Clearing land next to the Dining Hall to accommodate an adjoining tent for more dining space.
- Major renovations to several staff cabins, including bathroom upgrades.
- A new outboard rescue boat for the Small Crafts beach.



Carroll County YMCA Camp Huckins 2021 Summary of Financial Position


hanks to the generosity of you, our CCYMCA Camp Huckins community, we celebrated a healthy and joyful re-opening in 2021. We would not have been prepared to welcome over 1500 campers and staff, family campers, and mother/daughter participants without your support.

The importance of a Huckins summer has never been greater. After a year of isolation and connecting through computers and phones, the ability to be together under the pines was a necessary gift. Summer 2021 saw camp return to life—cabins full of laughter, departments full of activity, singing, vespers and a baby loon! We jumped off the tower, celebrated College Day, and sat together talking at picnic tables. The investments made in the facility helped us be prepared to deliver camp in the pandemic. The time and resources invested in planning and staffing allowed us to deliver a healthy Huckins experience.

We are grateful to all who worked to make sure we were ready to re-open in 2021 – it was a giant team effort! Thank you to the many volunteers who provided guidance and person power. Thank you to the staff that made every day special and the campers who brought joy.

And thank you to all who donated so generously. Your dollars went toward scholarships, making camp a possibility for more young people. You provided support to our campers and staff, our programming, and our facility, allowing us to begin catching up on maintenance we deferred in 2020.

Your gifts were, and continue to be, an investment in the future of Huckins. We are grateful!

Capital Improvements at Huckins

n 2021, investing in capital improvements to support a safe re-opening of camp in the context of COVID was the primary driver of our work. We continued to invest substantially in our facility with a wide range of Capital Improvement Projects and Purchases. Some of the projects that supported COVID safety were also identified in the Master Planning work started in 2018 and tied back to the strategic direction of the organization. While the Master Plan acts as our facility road map, the "need", funding, and most recently, our response to COVID and the pandemic, all play a role in the sequencing of these projects. Camper, staff and parent experience survey data was then overlayed in this process to ensure we are taking all perspectives into consideration.

Each year, the staff work diligently with the Buildings & Grounds Committee and the Board of Directors to identify, plan, and execute these projects, centering on enhancing the camper and staff experience, and ensuring we are caring for the valuable resource that is our facility.

Last year, the following projects were completed as part of our annual Capital Expenditure process:



Acoustic panels on the ceiling of the sports complex have greatly improved all-camp gatherings.

Sports Complex Upgrades The existing metal roof was removed and replaced with a plywood and asphalt shingle system. This has improved the user experience immensely, providing a quieter space to gather, especially during inclement weather. In addition, acoustic panels were installed on the roof trusses and walls to further improve the interior acoustics. These improvements were vital to summer 2021. As a result, we had a usable space where the entire camp could gather safely, maintaining our COVID distancing guidelines.



A 14 ft addition in the Health Center increased flexibility in staffing and camper care.

Health Center Expansion & Renovation In response to COVID, Huckins worked closely with the team at Simons Architects on this project. The project resulted in a 14 ft addition, which allowed us to maintain our eight-bed ward, while adding two additional isolation rooms, both with private bathrooms. The renovations also allowed space to house one additional nurse so that we could increase the size of our health care team.

Dining Hall Improvements & Food Service Changes Joel worked tirelessly on designing and implementing a revised COVID dining and food service plan in the months leading up to summer. This plan resulted in Camp

transitioning to a served buffet service style. This required upgrades and additions to our electrical service, and the purchase of steam tables to serve food from. In addition, Huckins contracted with Capozza Flooring to grind down and re-finish our floor. The floor was upgraded to an epoxy with a flaked finish. This resulted in a more aesthetically pleasing floor that is less slippery and easier to clean.

Ventilation Improvements Exhaust fans were added to all camper sleeping cabins as well as our Program Office. These fans provided our community with increased ventilation, moving air through sleeping cabins and shared staff spaces. This improvement was identified as part of our COVID planning process.

House Purchase To deliver our mission and a safe Huckins experience, we need to add additional staff to our team. This means added stress on our housing capacities. In May 2021, the opportunity arose to purchase an abutting house and property. Our Board of Directors seized this chance to add additional staff housing capacity and provide an extra buffer of land between the main camp and Huckins Road. The house is 1,600sq. ft, with 3 bedrooms and 2.5 bathrooms.
